

# PUBLIC HEALTH, B.S. (STLCC 2+SLU)

This program plan is part of the formal 2+SLU transfer agreement between St. Louis Community College and Saint Louis University.

Students in this program will satisfy the degree requirements published in the 2025-2026 academic catalog at St. Louis Community College and the 2026-2027 academic catalog at SLU. Students must complete all courses and transfer to SLU by the fall 2029 semester.

- Students must complete all the courses outlined on the program plan unless an exception is approved by SLU.
- Students must complete an application for admission.

- Students must present a 2.50 cumulative GPA at the time of transfer to SLU.

## Program Plan

Students may change the sequence in which they complete courses at their home institution. Students who complete a course that is not part of this program plan are encouraged to contact SLU to see if the course could be substituted.
