

CREDIT FOR PRIOR LEARNING

Undergraduate students at Saint Louis University may receive credit for prior learning through the following means:

Credit By Assessment

Students will receive credit for courses completed in service schools and in Military Occupational Specialties (MOS) on the basis of recommendations made by the American Council on Education (ACE) (<https://www.acenet.edu/Pages/default.aspx>) in its Guide to the Evaluation of Educational Experiences in the Armed Services and the National Guide to Educational Credit for Training Programs.

Credits received are subject to the same policies as those of any other transfer credit.

Students who are active military or reservists and participated in the off-duty, voluntary education programs of the Department of Defense, may receive credit for coursework taken while active military or in reserves.

Recommendations made by ACE for vocational or technical credit are considered on the same basis as and with the same limitations as those placed in nonmilitary sources of credit.

Credit By Exam

Saint Louis University recognizes the value of college preparatory exams and awards credit for those that demonstrate equivalency to college-level coursework.

Undergraduate students may earn credit by exam, with department approval, through qualifying scores on either college equivalent or college preparatory exams.

Criteria for Awarding Credit

- Exam content must align with Saint Louis University's college-level coursework.
- Official score reports, transcripts or documentation of exam results must be provided.
- Minimum scores or grades, as determined by Saint Louis University, must be met.

- Off-campus courses taken before fall 2025 do not count toward the nine-credit-hour limit of off-campus courses.
- Courses taken at SLU-approved study abroad locations (<https://studyabroadprograms.slu.edu/?FuseAction=Programs.ListAll>) do not count toward the nine-credit-hour limit of off-campus courses.
- Exceptions for other study abroad/away may apply.

High School Dual Enrollment

1818 Advanced College Credit Program (<https://catalog.slu.edu/colleges-schools/academic-affairs/1818-advanced-college-credit-program/>)

College credit earned through high school dual enrollment or dual credit outside of Saint Louis University's 1818 program is evaluated for transfer credit following the university transfer credit policy.

Transfer Credit

Students who have completed coursework at regionally accredited (https://catalog.slu.edu/academic-policies/academic-policies-procedures/regional_accreditation/) colleges or universities may request an evaluation for transfer credit.

Coursework may be considered for transfer credit if all of the following conditions are met:

- The coursework is completed at a regionally accredited (https://catalog.slu.edu/academic-policies/academic-policies-procedures/regional_accreditation/) institution or dean-approved international institution.
- The final grade posted for each potential transfer course is a "C" letter grade (or above).
- The Office of the University Registrar has received either
 - a sealed official transcript, sent to the Office of the University Registrar, One Grand Blvd. St. Louis, MO 63103, or
 - an official electronic transcript sent to registrar@slu.edu.

Students may be asked to provide a syllabus containing a written description of the course(s) from the other institution.

Transfer credit for which there is no direct SLU equivalent will be awarded elective credit.

Off-campus courses (after matriculation) are courses taken after a student has begun their studies at Saint Louis University that are offered or completed at a location other than St. Louis, Madrid or an approved study abroad/away location.
