Accreditation

Requirements

Admission Requirements

Students are eligible to apply to Saint Louis University's Bioethics and Health Studies to Law, J.D. accelerated program any time in their undergraduate career.

After completing 75 credits, students will apply to SLU's School of Law (<https://www.slu.edu/law/>). If admitted to SLU Law, these students will begin their J.D. program in their fourth year.

Students must complete at least 91 credits before beginning law school coursework. These must include the Undergraduate University Core requirements and major requirements.

Program Requirements

Each accelerated program student will be assigned a faculty mentor in the Albert Gnaegi Center for Health Care Ethics, who will meet with the student every semester. These meetings will ensure that the student makes timely progress toward a degree.

Students must maintain a 3.50 cumulative GPA to continue in the accelerated program. The health care ethics faculty mentor will also review each accelerated student's academic record at the end of each semester. Any student whose cumulative GPA falls below 3.50 will go on probation. If the student's GPA does not improve to the minimum level of 3.50 throughout 30 subsequent credits, the student will be suspended from the accelerated program. A student who is suspended from the accelerated program will be allowed to continue with the B.A. in Bioethics
