

MEDIEVAL LATIN, MICROCREDENTIAL

Saint Louis University's microcredential in medieval Latin consists of six required credit hours. Satisfactory completion of the required courses would give the student the skills and knowledge necessary for developing advanced-level comprehension of Latin through the acquisition of appropriate vocabulary and grammar, practices of reading and writing, and an understanding of the various genres of Latin and the cultures for which it was a form of communication between 350 and 1650 C.E.
