Students examine the social, cultural and organizational dimensions of teaching and learning while developing the knowledge and skills necessary to improve educational practice in schools, higher education and community-based settings.

Faculty in curriculum and instruction bring extensive experience as educators and researchers in K–12 and postsecondary contexts. Areas of expertise include assessment, literacy and language arts, mathematics education, science and STEM education, civics and citizenship, educational psychology, race and racial equity, international education, and instructional communication.

Students work closely with faculty mentors to develop individualized programs of study aligned with their professional contexts, research interests and learning goals.
